

From 1 November, your kerbside waste and recycling collections will be managed by Amey.

We'd like to reassure you that there will be no immediate changes to your main household recycling and waste collections from November.

We will be introducing improvements in 2016 and will tell you more about these before they happen. There's nothing you need to do differently for now, please keep putting your bins or bags out on their usual collection day.

Continue to place your waste for collection at the kerbside, from 7pm the evening before collection and by 7am on collection day.

To report missed collections, or book any of our available waste services, please call us on 01983 823777 or do it online at www.iwight.com/waste. You can also check your bin collection day online.

Here is some information on our waste services:

- Assisted collections – for householders who cannot manage the wheeled bin that has been provided, or cannot place their waste and recycling at the kerbside.
- Clinical waste collections – for householders who are advised by a medical practitioner that this is necessary.
- Bulky waste collections - for items such as furniture and large domestic appliances; we will collect up to four items for £25.
- Green waste - collection sacks will continue to be available from libraries. These will now be collected by a dedicated vehicle on recycling collection day and taken for composting. This service must be booked three days in advance of your recycling collection day.
- Free real Christmas tree recycling - between January 7th – February 4th. This service can be booked three days in advance of collection from January 4th onwards.

Waste that can be recycled...

Goes loose into your wheeled bin. Some properties are provided with clear sacks for recyclable waste instead of a wheeled bin. Please do not use black sacks when placing waste into your recycling wheeled bin.

If you are on the rural round, recyclable waste goes in your wheeled bin, tied in the clear sacks provided.

It helps if all bottles and tins are empty and rinsed out. You do not have to remove labels.

- Paper: Newspapers, magazines, catalogues, phone directories, yellow pages, junk mail, envelopes, writing and computer paper, wrapping paper, greetings cards
- Plastic bottles: fizzy drinks, squash, cleaning products, milk bottles, shampoos etc
- Plastic tubs: yoghurt pots, margarine, food containers etc
- Plastic bags
- Glass: bottles and jars
- Cardboard: packaging, cereal boxes, toilet and kitchen roll tubes, tea bag boxes etc
- Metals: food tins, drinks cans, aluminium foil



Waste that cannot be recycled...

Goes in your dustbin (black sack).

- Vacuum cleaner bags
- Nappies/sanitary items/textiles
- Glass cookware/mirrors
- Paper/foil contaminated with food
- Cling film/bubble wrap
- Broken crockery
- Cold ash
- Pill packets
- Polystyrene
- Sweet wrappers/crisp packets/ Pringles tubes
- Shredded paper



Waste that can go into the food caddy...

Food waste may be placed in the caddy in a carrier bag.

- All cooked and uncooked food
- Fish and meat bones
- Tea bags/coffee grounds
- Egg shells
- Fruit and vegetable peelings



Waste to take to a Household Waste Recycling Centre...

- Old clothing/shoes/handbags
- Batteries
- Low energy light bulbs
- Mobile phones
- CDs/DVDs
- Printer cartridges
- Electrical items
- Large metal items
- Wood
- Garden waste
- Books
- Bricks/soil/rubble (Lynnbottom Household Waste Recycling Centre only)
